

#### In 2025, Drama Teacher Conference will turn 10!

Over the last decade, the National Theatre has remained committed to providing space for teachers to find community, to develop their practice and, fundamentally, to create.

Last year, we welcomed **131** teachers to the National Theatre for two days packed with workshops by industry leading professionals. We were delighted to be joined by director Katie Mitchell in the launch of *Practitioners in Practice* (more information here) as well as devising workshops with Gecko Theatre, insights into set-texts with Quirky Bird and Noughts and Crosses. Teachers took the chance to wind down in creative writing and yoga classes, and to explore technical skills with the NT Lighting and Sound departments.
