The National Theatre today releases first look images of <u>Here We Are</u>, the final musical by the legendary **Stephen Sondheim.** Inspired by two of **Luis Buñuel**'s iconic films, *Here We Are* has a book by Tony Award-nominee **David Ives** (*All in the Timing/Venus in Fur*) and directed by two-time Tony Award-winner **Joe Mantello** (*WICKED /Assassins*). The UK premiere of *Here We Are* runs in the National Theatre's Lyttelton theatre until 28 June 2025.
